

A Bill to Fund Research on Crispr

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 Section 1. \$10 billion shall be set aside in the government for research modification on Crispr  
2 Research.

3 Section 2. CRISPR technology is a simple yet powerful tool for editing genomes(genes). It  
4 allows researchers to easily alter DNA sequences and modify gene function.

5 Section 3. Funding the implementation will come from the Center for Disease Control.

6 Section 4. This law will go into effect on January 1, 2020.

7 Section 5. All laws that are in conflict with this new legislation shall hereby be declared null and  
8 void.

## A Resolution to Limit Offshore Banking

1 WHEREAS, Offshore banking lead to a decrease in tax revenue for the government, and

A Bill to Implement a Higher Child Tax Credit for Adoptions

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 Section 1: All adults that adopt a child shall receive an additional \$5000 in expendable child tax  
2 credit per adopted child.

3 Section 2: The expendable child tax credit is a partially refundable (up to \$1400) tax deductible  
4 per child. This tax credit can only be collected by single parents with an annual income of  
5 up to \$200,000, or a married couple with up to \$400,000 in annual income. You may also  
6 stack the tax credits.

7 Section 3: The IRS shall be in charge of both the implementation and execution of this bill.

8 Section 4: This bill shall go into effect as of April 15, 2020.

9 Section 5: All laws that are in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Stop and Frisk

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. All Police Departments are hereby banned from using “Stop and Frisk” or “Terry  
2 Stop” procedures in order to find contraband.

3 SECTION 2. Stop and frisk is the practice by which a police officer initiates a stop of an  
4 individual on the street allegedly based on reasonable suspicion of criminal  
5 activity.

6 SECTION 3. The DOJ in cooperation with the FBI will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

7 SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented immediately upon passage.

8 SECTION 5. All other laws that are in conflict shall hereby be declared null and void.

A Bill to End Daylight Savings

- 1 SECTION 1. Daylight savings shall hereby be abolished in the United States.

- 3 SECTION 3. This bill shall be overseen by the Interstate Commerce Commission.
- 4 SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect at January 1, 2021.

- 6 void.

A Bill to Prevent States charging Property Tax

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 Section 1: The federal government shall prevent state governments from charging property tax.
- 2 Section 2: Property tax is defined as a real estate tax that is calculated by a local government and  
3 which is paid by the owner of the property.
- 4 Section 3: This bill shall be overseen by the Department of Taxation and Finance. Section 4: This  
5 bill shall take effect at the next fiscal year, October 1, 2019.
- 6 Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A RESOLUTION TO REJOIN THE PARIS CLIMATE ACCORD

1 WHEREAS 175 countries have signed the Paris Climate Accord; and  
2 WHEREAS the Paris Climate Accord is seen as the planet's best chance at mitigating climate  
3 change; and  
4 WHEREAS it is critical that the United States take a leadership role on climate change; and  
5 WHEREAS despite widespread opposition, President Donald Trump unilaterally withdrew the  
6 United States from the agreement; now, therefore, be it  
7 RESOLVED by the Congress here assembled that the United States should rejoin the Paris  
8 Climate Accord.

**FINALS BILL:****A BILL TO CONSTRUCT A BORDER BARRIER**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1: A steel slat barrier will be constructed at the United States-Mexico border.

2 SECTION 2: Steel slats shall be defined as steel poles.

3 SECTION 3: This bill will be implemented by the Department of Homeland Security. \$6 billion  
4 dollars will be allocated for the building. Barriers will be constructed at areas of  
5 the border that I.C.E. deems to be of the highest priority. At least 50% of the steel  
6 used in the barriers must have been produced in the United States.

7 SECTION 4: This bill shall go into effect immediately.

8 SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Implement Universal Basic Income

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 Section 1: The United States Federal Government will give \$1,000 per month to every single  
2 citizen 18 years and older.

3 Section 2 A This program will be funded by consolidating welfare programs and implemented a  
4 10 percent Value Added Tax.

5 Section 2 B A Value-Added Tax (VAT) is a tax on the production of goods or services a business  
6 produces.

7 Section 3 : The Department of Labor will implement this legislation.

8 Section 4 This bill shall go into effect January 1st, 2021.

9 Section 5 All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
