

A Bill to Fund Research on Crispr

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 Section 1. \$10 billion shall be set aside in the government for research modification on Crispr
2 Research.

3 Section 2. CRISPR technology is a simple yet powerful tool for editing genomes(genes). It
4 allows researchers to easily alter DNA sequences and modify gene function.

5 Section 3. Funding the implementation will come from the Center for Disease Control.

6 Section 4. This law will go into effect on January 1, 2020.

7 Section 5. All laws that are in conflict with this new legislation shall hereby be declared null and
8 void.

A Resolution to Limit Offshore Banking

1 WHEREAS, Offshore banking lead to a decrease in tax revenue for the government, and
2 WHEREAS, the amount of money that's put in offshore banking gets taxed less, as well as the
3 chief executive's income, and

5 social security, infrastructure, and public transit, therefore be it
6 RESOLVED, By this congress to limit offshore banking by prohibiting wealthy
7 corporations from hiding their profits in offshore banks.

A Bill to Implement a Higher Child Tax Credit for Adoptions

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 Section 1: All adults that adopt a child shall receive an additional \$5000 in expendable child tax
2 credit per adopted child.

3 Section 2: The expendable child tax credit is a partially refundable (up to \$1400) tax deductible
4 per child. This tax credit can only be collected by single parents with an annual income of
5 up to \$200,000, or a married couple with up to \$400,000 in annual income. You may also
6 stack the tax credits.

7 Section 3: The IRS shall be in charge of both the implementation and execution of this bill.

8 Section 4: This bill shall go into effect as of April 15, 2020.

9 Section 5: All laws that are in conflict with this bill are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban Killing Animals

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. If an animal kills a person, the animal should NOT be killed for the accident
2 that happened.

3 SECTION 2. a.) When a wild, domestic, or animals in captivity hurts or kills the human, the
4 animal will have 3 opportunities until it gets killed by a human.

5 b.) The 3 opportunities means on the 1st time, the animal will not hurt a human
6 or a person. 2nd, the animal will be sent AWAY from humans, and be released.

7 Finally on the 3rd opportunity, the animal will get euthanized.

8 SECTION 3. This bill shall be overseen by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection.

9 SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect at July 1, 2020.

10 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Criminalize Dog Mills

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. All dog mills will be illegal to operate in the United States.

2 SECTION 2. Dog mill shall be defined as any compound or facility where dogs are

3 commercially raised in large numbers through forced breeding practices.

4 SECTION 3. The United States Department of Justice shall oversee the implementation of this

5 bill.

6 SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect immediately upon passage.

7 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Reduce High Income Tax Deductions

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

1 SECTION 1: All households in the upper class will have their tax deduction options decreased
2 to 10%.

3 SECTION 2: High income is defined along IRS lines: \$157,500 and up for single taxpayers
4 and \$315,000 and up for married couples filing jointly. This is the threshold of the
5 32% tax bracket in 2018.

6 SECTION 3: The IRS and the Department of Labor shall oversee the implementation of this
7 legislation.

8 SECTION 4: This piece of legislation shall take effect in January 2020.

9 SECTION 5: All laws in conflict will hereby be declared null and void.

FINALS BILL:

A Bill To Punish Fossil Fuel Companies for Climate Change

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

1 SECTION 1. U.S Fossil fuel companies or any fossil fuel company that produces oil or sells oil
2 in the U.S will have to find ways to get clean energy to their customers. If not, they will be
3 taxed by the government to prevent more climate change.

4 SECTION 2. It will apply to any U.S company that produces or is harming the environment
5 with fossil fuels. The companies will be taxed 22% more on top of their usual tax bracket
6 of the income that they receive from selling energy.

7 SECTION 3. Environmental Protection Agency shall oversee the enforcement and
8 implementation of this bill.

9 SECTION 4. This bill will go into effect in January 1, 2020.

10 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

FINALS BILL:

A Bill to Remove Inefficient Cars from the Road

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. The Department of Transportation shall implement a national vehicle retirement
2 program designed to remove fuel inefficient vehicles from use.

3 SECTION 2. Vehicles that have failed their most recent SMOG test and vehicles whose fuel
4 efficiency is at or below 18 miles per gallon qualify for the vehicle retirement
5 program.

6 SECTION 3. The Department of Transportation shall oversee the enforcement and
7 implementation of this bill.

8 A. The Department of Transportation shall compensate vehicle owners at the current market
9 value of their vehicle based on performance at a minimum value of \$600 and not
10 to exceed \$4000.

11 SECTION 4. This law shall go into effect January 1, 2022.

12 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void,

FINALS BILL:

A Resolution to Reform Judicial Selection

1 WHEREAS, the United State judicial selection process for district, appellate, and Supreme Court
2 positions is not effective; and

3 WHEREAS, no formal requirements are specified in the nomination and confirmation process;

4 WHEREAS, the current system of nomination and confirmation is marred by partisan gridlock
5 and political influence; and

6 WHEREAS, judicial nominees should possess at least five years of legal experience; and

7 WHEREAS, judicial nominees should be United States citizens; and

8 WHEREAS, nominees should have no morally compromising criminal record; and

9 WHEREAS, judicial nominees should have a juris doctorate; now, therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, By the Congress here assembled that Congress should reform the judicial selection
11 process to ensure it is without bias, without corruption, produces quality nominees, and
12 upholds democracy.
