

A Bill to Ban Stop and Frisk

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 SECTION 1. All Police Departments are hereby banned from using “Stop and Frisk” or “Terry
2 Stop” procedures in order to find contraband.

3 SECTION 2. Stop and frisk is the practice by which a police officer initiates a stop of an
4 individual on the street allegedly based on reasonable suspicion of criminal
5 activity.

6 SECTION 3. The DOJ in cooperation with the FBI will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

7 SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented immediately upon passage.

8 SECTION 5. All other laws that are in conflict shall hereby be declared null and void.

A RESOLUTION TO CEASE ARMING TEACHERS

1 WHEREAS: School shootings and other violent acts have recently graced media headlines, and

2 WHEREAS: Over-saturation by media sources has led many to believe the situation is rampant
3 and out of control, and

4 WHEREAS: Such manic public reactions have called for states and local legislatures to arm
5 teachers with firearms, in an attempt to curb school violence, and

6 WHEREAS: Reports from the CDC, NCJRS, and National Center for Educational Statistics all
7 find that school violence has decreased since 1993, and

8 WHEREAS: Firearms in the classroom increase both the chance for accidental discharge and the
9 potential for hostile escalation, therefore

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS STUDENT CONGRESS that the carrying of firearms on any
11 public school property by any individuals who are not on-duty as a law
12 enforcement officer be banned. The state or condition of the weapon will not be
13 taken as a mitigating factor.

A Bill to Prevent States charging Property Tax

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Section 1: The federal government shall prevent state governments from charging property tax.

3 Section 2: Property tax is defined as a real estate tax that is calculated by a local government and
4 which is paid by the owner of the property.

5 Section 3: This bill shall be overseen by the Department of Taxation and Finance.

6 Section 4: This bill shall take effect at the next fiscal year, October 1, 2019.

7 Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Subsidize Space-Based Solar Panels (SBSP) to Establish Renewable Energy
Infrastructure with India**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Section 1.** The United States congress shall denote an initial five-year \$20 million program to
3 the US-based National Space Society to develop contributing technologies and
4 build a competent work force culminating in a roadmap for a demonstration
5 prototype.

6 **Section 2.** This implementation will be conducted under the NSS-Kalam Initiative, a joint
7 partnership between the United States and India in order to implement Space-
8 Based Solar Panel technology.

9 **Section 3.** The US Department of State shall oversee the enforcement of this legislation.

10 The Department of Energy will work with the National Aeronautics Space
11 Administration (NASA) oversee that this subsidy is effectively used for the
12 purpose of developing SBSP infrastructure.

13 The US Secretary of State shall further engage with the Indian-based
14 International Space Society (ISS) to ensure similar development is made.

15 **Section 4.** This subsidy shall be given in the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2020.

16 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Ratify the Mine Ban Treaty

1 **WHEREAS**, Over 110 million land mines are currently deployed around the world; and

2 **WHEREAS**, Over 1 million people around the world have been killed and injured by anti-
3 personnel landmines; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Several hundred thousand children are currently disabled due to injuries sustained
5 because of landmines; and

6 **WHEREAS**, The United States remains one of the largest producers of landmines and retains
7 one of the largest stockpiles of landmines; and

8 **WHEREAS**, The United States government recognizes mines as weapons of mass destruction
9 when used by individuals or organizations; and

10 **WHEREAS**, The United States continues to refuse to ratify Convention on the Prohibition of
11 the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on
12 their Destruction (Mine Ban Treaty); now, therefore, be it

13 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that the Congress here assembled ratify the Mine
14 Ban Treaty; and, be it

15 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the definition of “weapon of mass destruction” be expanded
16 to include use of mines by governments and militaries.

A Resolution to replace textbooks with digital tablets

1 **WHEREAS**, access to quality public education in the United States is deteriorating and we
2 need to change our public education system to better adapt to 21st century
3 workplace demands; and

4 **WHEREAS**, tablets are much lighter than print textbooks and have the capacity to increase
5 student productivity and creativity; and

6 **WHEREAS**, textbooks currently harm the environment with enormous use of paper; now,
7 therefore, be it

8 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that the Student Congress recommend public
9 schools across the country replace textbooks with digital tablets immediately.

FINALS BILL:**A Resolution to Abolish the U. S. Department of Education**

1 **WHEREAS**, the United States Department of Education has failed to improve education for
2 public school students; and

3 **WHEREAS**, the U. S. Department of Education has had its budget increased six times since its
4 creation in 1979 but has shown little or no impact in improving student test scores
5 in math, reading, or science; and

6 **WHEREAS**, the United States is ranked 24th out of 65 countries in its public education system;
7 now, therefore, be it

8 **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled to dissolve the United States Department of
9 Education. All decisions regarding the oversight and funding of public education
10 shall be left to the State.

FINALS BILL:**A Bill to Regulate the Non-proliferation Treaty**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Section 1.** Due to recent rises in tension, the United States will further regulate the Nuclear
3 Nonproliferation Treaty with countries obtaining or seeking to obtain nuclear
4 weapons and technology in order to establish stability within the international
5 community.

6 **Section 2.** The Non-proliferation Treaty or the NPT will be defined as the international
7 agreement which goal is to prevent the further spread and production of nuclear
8 weapons and weapons technology. Its ultimate objective is to encourage
9 international cooperation on nuclear energy use.

10 **Section 3.** The agencies that will oversee this legislation are the Department of International
11 Affairs, the Department of Energy, and the National Nuclear Security
12 Administration.

13 **Section 4.** This legislation will be put into effect on July 1, 2020.

14 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

FINALS BILL:

A Bill to Create More Psychiatric Hospitals

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **Section 1.** Since the shortage of psychiatric hospitals has increased homelessness, the United
3 States will build more hospitals.

4 **Section 2.** There are three ambiguous terms:

5 A. A mentally ill person is someone who is unable care for themselves due to the nature of
6 their illness.

7 B. Psychiatric hospitals will also include rehabilitation centers for drug and alcohol,
8 though these facilities will be strictly limited to those who are defined as
9 mentally ill.

10 C. The amount of hospitals that will be built will have the ratio of: 1 hospital for
11 every 200,000 people living in the surrounding area.

12 **Section 3.** The groups that will oversee this action are:

13 A. NIMH

14 B. HBE Corporation

15 **Section 4.** This legislation will be put into effect on February 11, 2020.

16 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
